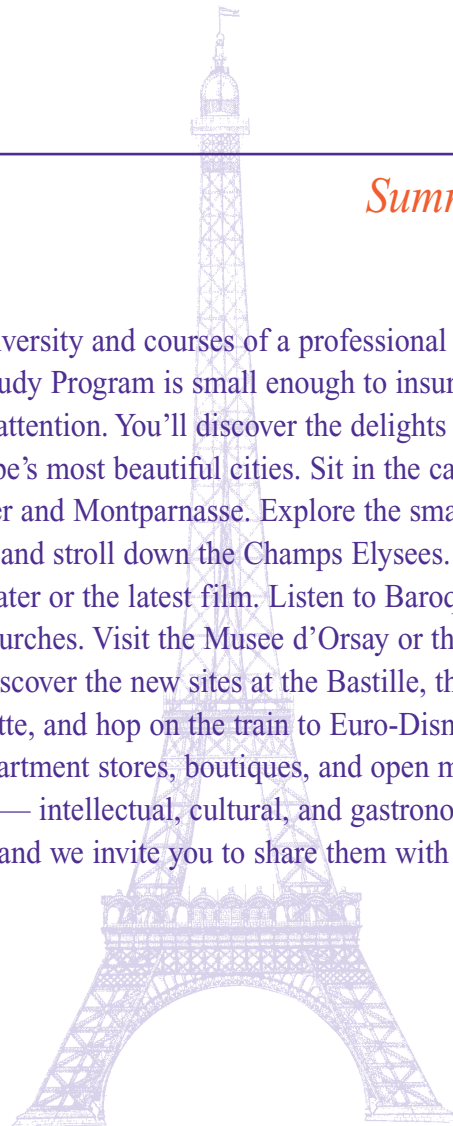

For the 53rd consecutive year, Temple University invites students and teachers of French to spend an unforgettable summer in Paris studying at the Sorbonne. Join people from all over the country, of various ages and backgrounds, and share a valuable learning experience in an ideal setting. Temple University offers you the opportunity to study at one of the world's great universities, to develop your language skills, and to make lasting friendships in a relaxed and congenial atmosphere.

Courses at the Sorbonne are designed to fit your individual needs, whether you are a beginner, a student with some experience, or a teacher wishing to sharpen your skills. Although Temple-in-Paris is a university-level program, selected high school seniors may be accepted. Large enough

to provide diversity and courses of a professional quality, the Sorbonne Study Program is small enough to insure personal contact and attention. You'll discover the delights of living in one of Europe's most beautiful cities. Sit in the cafés of the Latin Quarter and Montparnasse. Explore the small streets of Montmartre and stroll down the Champs Elysees. Enjoy classical theater or the latest film. Listen to Baroque music in Gothic churches. Visit the Musee d'Orsay or the Picasso Museum. Discover the new sites at the Bastille, the Louvre, and La Villette, and hop on the train to Euro-Disney. Shop in exciting department stores, boutiques, and open markets. The possibilities — intellectual, cultural, and gastronomical — are endless, and we invite you to share them with us.



The Program has been evaluated by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and received high marks for its performance. The report concludes by noting that "The Temple program as a whole gives every indication of delivering exactly what it promises, and its age and continuously high enrollments seem to attest to its success in the eyes of its participants."

Program Dates: July 1 to July 31, and July 1 to August 14

COURS PRATIQUE DE LANGUE FRANÇAISE

Monday through Friday, with native French professors. Offered on four levels (beginning, intermediate, upper, and advanced), this course includes review of grammar, phonetics laboratory, dictation, and method of explication de textes. The Cours Pratique may be taken for either four or six weeks and offers four or six credits, respectively. The teaching staff has taught Temple-in-Paris students for many years.

CONFERENCES DE CIVILISATION FRANÇAISE

Free lectures will be given by specialists in various aspects of contemporary France, including literature, art and aesthetics, and economic problems.

ADVANCED COURSES in language, literature, art, history, culture, and related subjects, available to participants in the four week program only, may also be taken for credit.

Advanced courses must be arranged through the Director, with additional fees paid directly to the Sorbonne.

WORKSHOP IN THE TEACHING OF FRENCH

Teachers of French may participate in a four-week course consisting of pedagogical lectures and on-site visits.

TRANSCRIPT

An official transcript of all college or university work (high school seniors must send high school transcript and a letter of recommendation from their school) must be mailed to International Programs, 200 Tuttleman Learning Center, 1809 N. 13th St., Temple University, Philadelphia, PA 19122.

No application can be processed until all material has been submitted.

ACADEMIC CREDIT

Temple University will grant six semester hours of credit with the six-week and four hours with the four-week course to all students admitted by Temple University (in conjunction with the Sorbonne placement test given in Paris) to a course above the level of the last French course for which they have received credit, provided they attend class regularly and meet academic standards. **Graduate credit will be given only to students meeting the standards of the Graduate School of Temple University, who have 24 hours credit in French above the intermediate level, and a B average in French.**

FACULTY ADVISOR

A faculty advisor will be in Paris. Dr. Ruth Thomas is Professor of French at Temple University. She received her B.A. degree from Bryn Mawr College and her Ph.D from Yale University.

ACCOMMODATIONS FRENCH FAMILY

Accommodations with selected French families, normally a single room, include breakfast each day and three evening meals a week. Students live in Paris or in the near suburbs.

FOYER INTERNATIONAL DES ETUDIANTES

The Foyer International accepts both men and women of various nationalities in a dormitory-type atmosphere. An older residence located close to the Sorbonne in the heart of the Latin Quarter, it has double rooms with mini-refrigerators, telephones, and hand basins in the rooms, and shared bathrooms on each floor. Continental breakfast is included at the Foyer cafeteria. There are many cafes and restaurants in the vicinity for other meals.

PENSION

These residences are open to both men and women, providing the atmosphere of a traditional French-speaking pension and the possibility of closer contact with French-speaking people. A pleasant walk along the famous Luxembourg gardens or through Latin Quarter streets takes you to the Sorbonne in a matter of minutes. The residences have double rooms equipped with telephones and showers. Accommodations include breakfast and dinner Monday through Friday and breakfast and a light meal on Saturday. For both the Foyer and the Pension, a few single rooms are available (first come, first served) at an additional fee of \$10-\$15 per night, payable before departure. **Students wishing to live in the pension should apply by March 3 to guarantee space.**

ENROLLMENT

The deadline for enrollment is April 1, 2003. After this date, applications will be considered on the basis of housing availability. Send application form (if additional application forms are needed, write the Director of the Sorbonne program), college transcript, and \$230 deposit/application fee. The balance must be postmarked no later than May 15, 2003, after which no refunds will be made.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

Travel arrangements are the responsibility of individual participants; the participation of Temple University is confined to academic matters. Students should plan to arrive in Paris on July 1. **Participants are advised to take out personal and baggage insurance.**

Program dates: For the four-week program, lodging is provided for 31 nights, from the night of July 1 through the night of July 31. For the six-week program, lodging is provided for 45 nights, from the night of July 1 through the night of August 14. Any lodging before or after these dates is the entire responsibility of participants.

All program fees are based on current information and subject to change.

These fees cover undergraduate tuition, double room accommodations, and a series of excursions. Graduate tuition and single-room accommodations at the Pension or Foyer will vary. The cost of travel to and from Paris is additional, as is the \$30 application fee.

There will be no refunds given after the student's registration at the Sorbonne.
